


A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.





Maureen was born August 30th, 1952, in Tulsa, Oklahoma. As a nearly life-long Tulsan she was a proud graduate of Edison High School. She attended Drury College in Springfield, Missouri where she was a member of the Pi Beta Phi sorority. Upon graduation she took a teaching position in Kansas City, later returning to Tulsa. There she continued her career in education at Holy Family School as a first-grade teacher and later as an administrator. During this time, she was also a member of the Epsilon Sigma Alpha Service Organization. Her distinguished career as a principal spanned over three decades with long stints at Holy Family, Cascia Hall, and finally at The School of St. Mary where she had recently retired at the completion of the 2021 school year. Shortly thereafter the Mayor of Tulsa proclaimed May 28th as "Maureen Clements Day" to honor her exemplary years of service. Maureen enjoyed travel, loved the beach, cruises, and weekends at Grand Lake. She had the wonderful ability to come along side people, to be invested in them, and to be present in a way that made them feel loved and valued. Maureen was a peacemaker and a helper. Her selfless devotion to her students, friends, and family was an example for us all. She was greatly loved and will be greatly missed.
